Unravelings J. Wayne Yawn

The only time I am glad the phone rings at an odd hour is when it turns out to be a wrong number. Otherwise it is bad news. Someone needs God and calls the pastor. I am humbled! My first reaction is panic. How best to represent God in the crisis? Oh how I have wished I had supernatural power to immediately change the bad news or reaction.

Psalmists have been in my position and turned to laments because God had seemingly forgotten them during crises. Many of the laments were written during famines or exiles or defeats by foreign powers that worshiped supposedly weaker gods. Where was the Psalmist's God? And if your experience is like mine and theirs, the answer is silence. I feel the weight of the silence. How I wish I had some button to press that would make it all better. But all I have is silence and to go to the caller and be with them. Well, there is one other thing! I can join them in lamenting how awful whatever it is they called about, actually is! I can just bring my own existence—Being—to sit beside their existence, and hurt and be angry—just BE with the hurting. I am coming to think that is what is eternal and divine—God-like. During times of Hebrew crises theologians often blamed the Hebrews for their bad news because God was angry and punishing them. But this theologian is coming to stand with some of the Psalmist who came to see that lamenting is the way! Laments are not to placate God to get God to reverse the bad. Laments are to change the Psalmist to think like God—called Love (the New Testament agape type)—which is experienced as “abundant” LIFE—life so full and real that people called it divine, when they experienced it personally in Jesus.

I recall a story told by the poet Ann Weems about her worst ever phone call. Her son had been killed less than an hour after his 21st birthday. Ann told her friend Walter Brueggemann (a Hebrew Bible authority who I find insightful) that she just could not get beyond the hurt and anger. He suggested she write the laments of her heart to God in order to hold her son close. She lifted up her hurt and her anger. To her amazement she said that over time by lamenting she began to loose the need to lament. Consolation came, and the pall covering her like a casket covers, began to lift. Did God reach down and intervene? Not as I used to think God is! But yes, in the way I am coming to think God really is, Life's Processes at their fullest and most abundant and real, even as Jesus promised in John 10:10. Maybe God reaches Up from Life more than reaches Down. God (or Life that is so real it is Divine) wants to heal me if I get the “nail in my shoe” image out. Yes, I admit that is a weird phrase to assign to an image of God, even one that I held for so long and mostly hurt and angered me. But, I think humans got our image of God wrong until someone came along, Jesus, and paid the ultimate price for getting it right. God didn't prevent his death, but brought Life Processes out of it. Getting the “nail” out takes admitting what it is, grieving to make room for the more accurate view of how God really heals, as through lamentations, just to name one way. That is really the historical context of Matthew 5's beatitudes—proverbs about how to live divinely. Recall one is about mourning. The context is mourning not the physically dead, but the dead ways of living to make room for the other life enhancing beatitudes to take root and give “abundant” life. I still panic when those calls come at odd hours. But I just go and am as is the caller, hurting, lamenting, and don't rush to calm.
